

## Alberta Water Polo Association Safe Sport Initiatives

The Safe Sport initiative is taking hold across Canada. From our federal government, national sports governing bodies, provincial organizations to individual clubs, recognition of this important movement is paramount to the health, safety and success of our youngest to oldest athletes.

In February 2019, <u>The Red Deer Declaration: For the Prevention of Harassment, Abuse and Discrimination in Sport was signed by the Federal, Provincial, and Territorial Ministers responsible for Sport, Physical Activity, and Recreation. Shortly afterwards the Federal Minister of Science and Sport announced the following:</u>

- That all Canadians have the right to participate in sport—in an environment that is safe, welcoming, inclusive, ethical and respectful. An environment that protects the dignity, rights and health of all participants.
- That there must be zero tolerance for gender-based violence and abuse in sport.
- And that we will work together to implement a collaborative, intergovernmental approach
  to address harassment, abuse and discrimination in sport—in the areas of awareness,
  policy, prevention, reporting, management and monitoring.

All national sport organizations, including Water Polo Canada, followed suit in declaring their commitment to Safe Sport. "Water Polo Canada is committed to offer to all of it's athletes and all individuals involved in the sport an environment free of all forms of abuse, harassment, bullying or discrimination."

AWPA sees this as an opportunity to create and/or improve our own processes within the organization and province which aligns with the AWPA strategic plan goal to strengthen our organizations. We are working towards reinforcing and incorporating principles of Safe Sport in a number of different ways:
